Parents of children from Grade 1 through to Grade 7 are encouraged to come and meet with their children's teacher/s between 14h00 and 17h00.

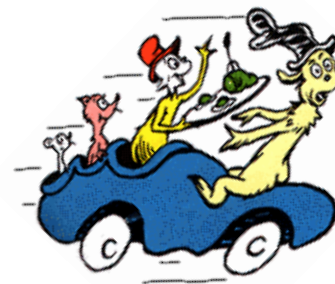
